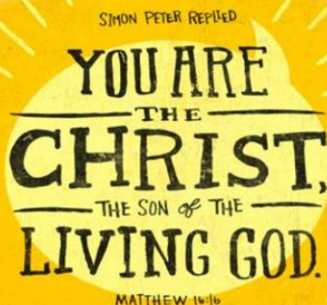

Eco - So, you're putting unwanted cardboard boxes from your online deliveries in your **recycling bin** and the empty shampoo bottle and aerosol deodorant but did you know that you can now recycle empty toothpaste tubes? Try to squeeze out as much of the paste as you can, put the lid back on and pop into your recycling bin.

Metal and plastic biscuit and sweet tins, the kind we tend to buy at Christmas, can also go in there along with black plastic pots, tubs and trays which were previously not recyclable.

Empty foil-based blister packs are welcome but not the plastic-based ones. You can also put empty bottles with a trigger spray or pump activator into your home recycling bin, you no longer have to put the trigger or pump into the general waste.

The technology and machinery is being improved all the time allowing us to recycle an increasing number of items that we couldn't in the past. If you'd like a searchable A-Z list of items and how to recycle them go to WestSussex.gov.uk/recycling website for more information.

Update on Nicci's health:

"I guess the top news of the past fortnight is that I had a hospital appointment a couple of days ago. Yet again, the NHS were fantastic – I couldn't fault any aspect of the visit! By the end of the day I had had a series of tests and investigations and seen both a consultant and an advanced nurse practitioner (plus radiographers, nursing assistants and even a medical student!) and been reassured that my symptoms were highly unlikely to be anything nasty. They recommended some treatment which will hopefully have me feeling a lot better within about a fortnight. Needless to say I was delighted and relieved at the news! I am hopeful that I will feel better and be able to make a decision about a return to Juba in the next few days."
